### **The impact of Pupil Premium Funding**

The majority of the Pupil Premium budget is allocated to TLA support in class. Without the extra TLA support it would be impossible to give as much time and help to the children. Due to the small size of our school teachers need to differentiate work into three bands for each year group – emerging, expected, exceeding – that means six levels of differentiation within each class, plus the extra differentiation needed for statemented pupils or those who need something different to allow them to access the curriculum.

They often work as part of a small group receiving extra adult support to encourage them to achieve their full potential. The TLA will not always work with these children, but their support in the class can allow the class teacher to focus on this group of children.

In terms 5 and 6 we used some of the budget to fund an extra teacher for small groups as they approached their end of year assessments.

A small amount of the budget is spent on funding educational visits and swimming lessons for the Pupil Premium children. This allows them to fully participate in all the school has to offer.

The impact of this support can be seen in the progress made by the Pupil Premium children. All the Pupil Premium children made at least 2 sub levels of progress in reading, writing and maths last year and one made better than 2 sub levels in writing.

#### Average points scores

Results for pupil premium pupils were above other pupils nationally in writing (+5.2%) and marginally below other pupils nationally in reading (-0.1%) and maths (-1.9%).

#### Attainment at Level 2B

Results show 100% of pupil premium pupils attained Level 2B or above in reading, writing and maths, exceeding national averages in all subjects.
