	Trees 1 This week and next we are going to explore the trees around us and design and make a book or leaflet about them. Today start by choosing one tree near where you live. It might be in your garden, In the street or in your local park or wood. When you have chosen your tree have a very good look at it. What kind of tree is it? Can you collect some leaves? Take a photo? Draw a picture? Work out the height of your tree using the sheet attached to tell you what to do. There are other ways to work out the height of trees. You could find another way and see if you get the same result with both methods!	Trees 2 Today make your booklet or leaflet for all your information trees. There are lots of ideas about making a book on pinterest if you want to be creative. If not a simple book is great – fold some paper in half –A4 or A3 -and then staple or sew down the middle fold. Make the cover from card – this could be the card from a cereal box. Choose the title for your book – make it exciting so the reader will want to read your book. Design your cover. You could find pictures of trees from magazines and make a collage, you could draw lots of different leaves or cut them out of green paper or Put on the name of the author (you!)	Trees 3 On the first page of your book make a contents page. Then number all the pages in your book. On page 1 stick in your picture from Monday or draw your tree and label the parts using the tree diagram. Can you remember all the different parts? Investigate what are the main functions of all the different parts. Record it in your book. Optional Now without looking at your book can you do the tree names cut out and match activity?	Trees 4 On the next page in your book do a detailed drawing of your leaf. Watch the leaf power point and look carefully at the slide that names the parts of leaves. Label your leaf drawing. Update your contents page.	Trees 5 Do some research about your kind of tree. For example How tall do they grow? What do the seeds look like? Where in the UK/world are they found? Are they deciduous? Evergreen? Write the research up into book. You could include any pictures you find. Keep your book as we will carry on this project next week.
